## **BMW'S AND PORSCHE'S TO SHINE AT TATTON**

Tatton Park Cheshire sees the 8th Annual BMW and Porsche Festival on Sunday September 2, the North of England's biggest event for these makes, organised jointly by the BMW Car and Porsche Clubs – and it plans to be even bigger and better than before.
